## The Jisc Collections model licence

- » Procure and license digital content to support teaching, learning and research.
- » 150 HE members, 400 FE members.
- » Over 300 online resources: e-journals, e-books, images, databases, film, sound, newspapers, archives, reference resources, geospatial data.

- » Consistency, transparency
- » Ensuring material can be used to its fullest potential
- » Protecting the offer
- » Driving standards
- » Different versions; regularly reviewed

- » Definition of “Authorised User”.
- » Permissions and restrictions.
- » Non-commercial use, for educational purposes, by authorised users only, over a secure network.

- » Inter-Library Loan
- » Copy / save / print “parts”
- » Use “parts” in academic works, teaching packs, VLEs
- » Deposit “parts” in repositories
- » TDM
