You also need to know what rights apply to your own work, and how you want others to share and re-use the content you create.

## **Copyright** for students

As part of your studies you may want to copy (photocopy, scan, o digitally copy) material from books, journals or web pages/sites. material is protected by copyright, which restricts when and how can use it.

### What is copyright?

Copyright is a type of intellectual property right. It covers all original works, such

- Books
- lournals
- Paintings
- Photographs
- Music
- Films
- Sound recordings and broadcasts
- Unpublished works, for example manuscripts.

Copyright is an automatic right which comes into force on the creation of a work. It doesn't need to be applied for or registered.

The creator of a work normally owns the copyright in that work.

You own the copyright to any work completed during your studies unless you are a postgraduate research (PGR) student and have assigned your intellectual property rights in some areas to the University at registration, or as part of a research funding agreement. PGRs continue to own the copyright to their theses. Search the Strathchyde website for 'PGR Convieto Liquidance' for more information.


