

The Project Timeline



Land art exists in situ for a fleeting moment; it is temporary by nature,²⁷ relying upon documentation to live on. Eventually, Richard Long started using words alongside images to describe his walks and earthworks, which he later exhibited in galleries. Often, not all forms of this documentation would survive the wheel of time, as shown in *Figure 2*, contrasted by *Figure 3*, which consists of both an image and a text. Action with the loss of the speech in the form of writing loses its agency and disclosure.²⁸ In Richard Long's case, the outcome of the work is different from the actions that usually invite the audience for further action. These works feed the viewer's imagination,²⁹ inviting them to be open to perceive. Through a personal experience, the world discloses itself to those open to its revelation.

The labour of the body


